





Chairman's Statement

The Trustees have pleasure in presenting our tenth annual report.

We marked our tenth anniversary with a ceremony at Xianghe, outside Beijing, on 5 November 2006. We were privileged that the Chinese Government wished to sponsor this ceremony alongside us, through the National Centre for Aids/STD Control & Prevention/Chinese CDC, and the Chinese Preventive Medicine Association, and in the presence of the Vice Minister of Public Health. The ceremony was combined with our seventh annual prizegiving, and with a 3-day seminar on MSM's - men having sex with men – giving a strong and public demonstration of the Chinese Government's concern to help Aids prevention in this community, and to avoid discrimination. The UK Government participated as co-sponsors of these November ceremonies with the presence of the British Ambassador in Beijing and the Head of DfID China.

In his speech on 5 November, Vice Minister Wang Longde thanked our Trust for our "exceptional contribution over ten years", and urged us "to continue our development and achievements on a bigger and better scale in the future".

With this warm official encouragement, and with the cooperation of so many friends around China, we look forward to the next ten years of our Trust's work. When we started in 1996 we could never have predicted the type of work which we would do in the ensuing ten years; and having started our second ten years, we are equally unable to predict. In the same way, we could not have predicted the astonishing changes in China and Chinese attitudes over the last ten years, and we certainly look forward to future great changes ahead and to adapting our work accordingly.

We have always tried to respond to the needs expressed to us by our friends in China, and this will remain our approach. We have also found that there continues to be a useful role for a small unbureaucratic foundation, with a good reputation, even though there are many larger private and governmental funds becoming available in the same field. We also feel that our Trust will acquire more of a Chinese character in the coming years, and we expect some of the young and brilliant Chinese people whom we meet to help us to integrate more deeply and effectively into Chinese society.

We also expect to build on the relations of the Trust which we have established, and which enable us to spend our money effectively – and a little money goes a long way in China. This will apply to all our current activities, including

- a) Our annual Barry & Martin's Prizes continue to recognise excellence in the field of Aids education, prevention, treatment and care – and to set a good example locally and nationally. We remain involved with all our prizewinners and with the work they are doing.
- b) The secondment of doctors and nurses between China and the UK has had golden results and will remain a core activity – especially with the cooperation between the Beijing Ditan and Beijing You'an Hospitals and the Chelsea & Westminster and St. Mary's Hospitals in London. We were also glad to sponsor a team from Bart's and The London Hospital to visit Shenzhen in December. There is room to develop this work further – and all the hospitals in the UK with whom we have contact are delighted to send their best people for short periods to China.

c) We support clinical activities in China, and the Peggy Health Centre in Dali, Yunnan continues to develop as a centre of excellence, and our work in other locations is proceeding well, including Simao, Yunnan, Chongqing and Xinjiang.

d) We are giving greater priority to the problems of the gay, or MSM, community – and we feel that the new definition of “sexual minority” blends with the traditional Chinese respect for the many racial minorities of China. We have worked closely with Professor Zhang Beichuan of Qingdao, and through him with gay groups in some 16 cities all over China. The cooperation between the gay groups and the health authorities has made huge progress in the last year, and we expect the government to move even faster. The rate of HIV infection in the gay community is increasing rapidly. This is a big challenge for the Chinese Government, and it welcomes the efforts and example of international groups.

We have been fortunate in the support and encouragement which we have received from a wide circle of friends outside China – in the UK and elsewhere in Europe, in the United States, and in various Asian centres. Our friends have contributed most generously, with donations amounting to £76,000 in 2006. Elizabeth Shields and The Mary Kinross Charitable Trust have been especially helpful, with Elizabeth joining us next month for a 15th visit to China in our company. We do not solicit donations, and in our annual return to the Charities Commission we always write “zero” against our costs of fund-raising. Our friends tell us that they like to support a small charity, with small overheads and administrations costs, so that the funds go almost entirely to the causes we support. This enabled us in the last year to make grants of £97,000 in China – making a total over the last ten years of more than £600,000 or RMB 9 million.

We are happy also that our links in the United States remain strong, and I set out at the end of this statement the 2006 list of donations to American Friends of Barry & Martin’s Charity, Inc, a 501 (c) 3 company incorporated in Delaware. We welcome Rosita Sarnoff to the Board of American Friends, and we thank the other directors, Michael Leigh, Carol Dauber, Philip Goodeve and Noel Sanborn, our US adviser Damien Lu and West Coast Chapter Linda Lee, and the generous donors of more than US\$10,000.

We greatly welcome the widening of our medical teams visiting China. Many of the doctors and nurses from London and Oxford have made several visits and numerous friends. As a result there are always many doctors and nurses at the London end who know about China and make the Chinese visitors more comfortable and effective. In this area the leadership of Professors Brian Gazzard and Frances Gotch has set the example throughout the life of our Trust, together with the Anglo-Chinese bridge-building quietly practised by Dr. Shisong Jiang and his colleagues at John Radcliffe Hospital, Oxford.

主席报告

贝利马丁基金会在此作第十个年度报告

贝利马丁基金会十周年的标志是 2006 年 11 月 5 日在距北京不远的河北香河所举行的典礼。很荣幸，中国政府对我们非常支持，中国疾控中心/性病艾滋病预防控制中心以及中国预防医学会共同参与、组织了这次典礼。同时还联合举办了贝利马丁奖第七届年度颁奖典礼，以及为期 3 天的关于男同性恋的学术会议——中国政府强烈关注和公开支持在这一人群中开展预防艾滋病及消除歧视的活动。英国政府作为协办方参加了 11 月典礼，英国驻中国大使和英国国际发展署中国办事处首席官员出席了典礼。

11 月 5 日，中国卫生部副部长王陇德在他的致辞中，感谢我们基金会十年来所做出的特殊贡献，激励我们继续努力，在未来更加发展壮大，取得更大的成就。

在中国政府的热情鼓励下，在众多中国朋友的努力合作下，我们对基金会未来的十年充满希望。1996 年在基金会的起始阶段，我们无法预言在随后的十年我们所做的工作；第二个十年已经开始，我们也无法预言以后会做什么。我们没有预测到中国和中国人的观念在过去十年发生的惊人变化，诚然，我们期待着未来发生更大的变化，并据此而调整我们的工作。

我们一直在回应我们的中国朋友向我们提出的需求，这仍然是我们今后的工作方式。我们还发现，尽管在同一领域出现了许多较大的私人和政府基金，但声誉好的非官僚小型基金仍然有用武之地。我们也感到，在不久的将来，我们的基金将更加富有中国特色，我们结识的一些才华横溢的中国年轻人定能帮助我们深入而有效地融入中国社会。

我们还要不断发展和完善基金的关系网络，以便使我们能够有效地利用资金，细水长流，以有限的资金在中国谋求长远的发展。我们目前所有的活动皆符合这一原则，目前我们的活动包括：

1) 我们的贝利马丁年度奖继续授予在艾滋病教育、预防、治疗和关怀领域做出杰出贡献者，为当地和全国树立良好的榜样。我们继续与我们的获奖者保持密切联系，并关注他们目前的工作。

2) 中英医护人员交流取得了重要成果，以后仍然是活动的主要内容——尤其是北京地坛医院和北京佑安医院与伦敦晨曦医院和圣玛丽医院之间的合作，这种合作以后仍将开

展。我们很高兴资助圣巴特医院和伦敦医院职员在 2006 年 12 月份访问深圳，这项活动还有深入开展的空间，我们接触的所有英国医院都很高兴派遣其优秀职员短期访问中国。

3) 我们支持中国的临床工作。云南大理的佩吉健康中心作为优秀的楷模，继续向前发展，在其他地区，包括云南思茅、重庆和新疆，我们的工作也进展顺利。

4) 我们非常关注男同性恋或 MSM 人群的问题。我们感到，“性少数民族”的新定义中含有类似于中国传统上对许多少数民族的尊重。我们与青岛的张北川教授密切合作，与中国 16 个城市的男同性恋小组一起工作。男同性恋小组与健康机构之间的合作在去年取得了巨大进步，我们希望政府的步子迈得更快一些。男同性恋人群中 HIV 感染率增加迅速，这对于中国政府是一个巨大的挑战，需要国际组织的努力和示范。

我们很幸运地得到中国以外的广大朋友的支持和鼓励，如英国和欧洲其它国家，美国和亚洲许多国家。我们的朋友慷慨解囊，2006 年捐款额达 76000 英镑。尤其是伊丽莎白·石友思和玛丽金若丝慈善基金会给予我们很大帮助，下个月伊丽莎白将与我们一起访问中国，这是她第 15 次访问中国。我们并不主动要求捐款，在我们每年向基金委员会提交的报告中募捐的成本为零。我们的朋友告诉我们，他们喜欢支持小型慈善基金，因为这些基金的日常开支和管理费用少，资金几乎全部用于所支持的事业上。我们去年在中国的赠款达 9 万 7 千英镑——过去十年的赠款总额超过 60 万英镑或接近 1 千万元人民币。

我们与美国的联系依然很密切，在这份报告的结尾附上 2006 年美国特拉华州贝利马丁慈善基金美国朋友基金会的捐赠目录（见英文报告部分）。我们欢迎 Rosita Sarnoff 加入美国朋友董事会，感谢 Michael Leigh, Carol Dauber, Philip Goodeve 和 Noel Sanborn 董事，美国顾问 Damien Lu，西海岸分会的 Linda Lee 及其 1 万多美元的慷慨捐赠。

我们医疗团队不断壮大，伦敦和牛津的许多医生和护士数次访华，结交了许多中国朋友。在伦敦总有许多熟悉中国的医生和护士，使中国来访的朋友感到生活舒适、工作方便。在这一方面，Brian Gazzard 和 Frances Gotch 教授自基金会成立以来一直在促进中英合作。姜石松博士及其在约翰拉德克利夫医院的同事默默创建了中英桥梁，为我们做出了表率。

Tenth Anniversary & Prizegiving 5 November 2006

China's National CDC sponsored with us our Tenth Anniversary Ceremony, together with the Chinese Preventive Medicine Association; and they proposed that we hold our prizegiving at the same time, as well as a 3-day seminar on MSM's (men having sex with men). This was intended as a public demonstration of the government's concern for the gay community during the Aids crisis, and its desire to combat stigma and discrimination.

Dali - The Good Friend Health Center

The Hospitals of Beijing



We have close relations with the two principal infectious diseases hospitals in Beijing, the Beijing You'an Hospital and the Beijing Ditan Hospital. We have over several years supported exchanges of doctors and nurses between these hospitals and Chelsea & Westminster Hospital and St. Mary's Hospital Paddington. The You'an and the Ditan are leading the way in outreach in the capital to HIV patients, and to the segment of the population where HIV infection is currently rising at the fastest pace, namely the gay community, where estimates among the gays of Beijing indicate a 10 per cent HIV infection rate. It is our policy to support these Beijing hospitals in their efforts to set the best example in China. In the photo above, at Ditan Hospital, are, left to right, Volunteer Xiao Qiang; Nurse Wang Kerong (our 2004 prizewinner); Dr. Xu Keyi, our Adviser and founder of the Red Ribbon Centre at Beijing Ditan Hospital; Nurse Han Jing (one of the group who visited Chelsea & Westminster Hospital in 2006); Volunteer Lao Ji and Nurse Qu Wenyan. The Ditan Hospital will move later this year to new buildings at the outskirts of Beijing, leaving behind its old but convenient buildings and gardens, adjacent to the Ditan Park.

The example set by these hospitals in Beijing is crucially important. In other parts of China there are few hospitals which offer the same caring service. There is little in the way of pre-test and post-test counselling outside Beijing, and little patient confidentiality. The recent law forbids any hospital in China to turn away an HIV patient – but this is not always respected, and hospitals outside Beijing generally have few HIV facilities and staff. Anti-retroviral drugs are theoretically available free of charge – but you do not get them if you are not a registered resident, and the drugs available are limited. There is no free medicine for opportunistic infections.

Gay Outreach
