We awarded our 8<sup>th</sup> annual Barry & Martin's Prize on 10 November 2007 to Dr. Zhang Jianbo of the Peggy Health Centre, No. 2 People's Hospital of Dali, Yunnan. Following this award, Dr. Zhang was invited to Beijing to receive the Memorial Prize of the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Fighting Aids. This was shown live on China's national television CCTV1 on 1 December 2007 – World Aids Day. This photograph is from that television broadcast. Since then, Dr. Zhang has been nominated as a Model Worker of Yunnan. Our Trust has been working with Dr. Zhang and his colleagues since 1998.

**Chairman's Statement**

The Trustees have pleasure in presenting our eleventh annual report. Our long-standing quartet of Trustees was sadly and suddenly depleted on 2 January 2008, when Barbara Lloyd died in a diving accident. We have had Barbara's encouragement and counsel since our Trust started in 1996, and she became well-known to our friends and partners and supporters in the UK and China and elsewhere.

We now welcome Eugene Chang to our Board of Trustees. Eugene is 55. He was born and educated in England and has spent most of his professional career in China. His presence in Beijing will be of great value to our official, medical and other friends around China – and of course to the Trustees and Advisers in London.

We have continued in 2007 to work with all our existing friends around China, always expanding our connexions gradually:

- (a) We awarded our 2007 Barry & Martin's Prize to Dr. Zhang Jianbo at the Peggy Health Centre, No 2 People's Hospital of Dali City, Yunnan. We have of course admired and supported the work of Dr. Zhang and his colleagues for the last 10 years, and their work has set an example of excellence in Aids treatment and care.
- (b) We have continued to cooperate with the 2 principal infectious diseases hospitals in Beijing, the Beijing Ditan and the Beijing You'an Hospitals. Both hospitals have been exemplary in their outreach to and care for Aids patients. This includes the Red Ribbon Centre at Beijing Ditan Hospital and the Ark of Love and Quiet Garden projects at Beijing You'an Hospital. We also cooperate in the capital with the National CDC and the Beijing Public Health Bureau, both of whom want to help the Beijing hospitals to set an example on Aids care to the whole of China, and to diminish stigma and prejudice.
- (c) We continue to cooperate with Dr. Zhang Beichuan of Qingdao Medical College on help to gay groups in nineteen cities around China – comprising more than half the provinces of China. In some cases this includes outreach to other high-risk groups like female sex-workers. This also includes migrants, who are a particularly large and vulnerable group in China, because of the continued movement of poor workers (mainly in the west) to the prosperous regions (mainly in the east).
- (d) We sponsored 2 major seminars in China during 2007. In November we and the Mary Kinross Charitable Trust (MKCT) brought a group of doctors and nurses to Chengdu, led by Dr. Clifford Leen of Western General Hospital in Edinburgh and including members from 3 London hospitals, Chelsea & Westminster, St. Mary's and Bart's and The London. This was co-sponsored by the National CDC and hosted by the People's Provincial Hospital of Sichuan, with whom our Trust and MKCT subsequently signed a Memorandum of Cooperation. Also in November we sponsored a group of doctors and nurses from Bart's and The London Hospital for a seminar in Guangzhou.
- (e) We revisited our friends in Xinjiang, especially at the Xinjiang Infectious Diseases Hospital (XIDH) in Urumqi and the Needle Exchange Centre in Yining City. We continue to support the outreach of XIDH to Aids patients

and their families, as well as an in-house facility for the patients, most of whom are poor members of the Muslim Uighur community. We are also beginning to support community hospitals in Xinjiang, starting with the Liu Dao Wan hospital outside Urumqi, where the local people are impoverished and vulnerable, following the closure of their coal mine.

- (f) We sponsored a doctor from Chengdu to come for training at Chelsea & Westminster Hospital. We have to thank Chelsea & Westminster for training many doctors and nurses from China under our sponsorship over the years.

We also have many friends to thank for their donations and other forms of support. Our friend Van Helden died in December 2006, and Chris Morris kindly suggested that donations might be sent to our Trust in his memory. Our new Trustee Eugene Chang entered into Civil Union in London with his partner Jet Liu. They suggested that their friends might contribute to our Trust rather than give wedding gifts. There was a dragon boat race in Oxford last Summer and our Trust was a named recipient of the funds raised. The Church of the Ascension in Blackheath again had a collection for our Trust – and I hope to attend divine service there before long and to tell the congregation about our work. We are also due to receive our first legacy, following the death of Barry's and my old friend Edwin Polakow in Johannesburg last summer, of South African Rand 10,000.

We are grateful to all our friends who have again supported our work so handsomely in 2007; and we are pleased that our donations (at £97,930) and grants (£95,187) should be so nearly matching.

We ended last year for the first time with a net asset position in excess of £1 million, following an increase in the value of our share portfolio in addition to the donations. Our portfolio is strongly weighted towards Hong Kong blue chips. This reflects our theory that the late Barry Chan, in whose memory our Trust operates, had faith in Hong Kong – and that if Hong Kong prospers we will have all the more funds to distribute to people who need it in China, including Hong Kong. This has worked well over many years.



## 2008年度贝利马丁基金会主席报告

我很高兴在此代表基金会董事会做第十一个年度报告。多年担任我们基金会董事之一的芭芭拉·劳逸德 (Barbara Lloyd) 在一次潜水事故中不幸去世，使得我们基金会遭遇到突然而不幸的打击。芭芭拉自1996年基金会成立以来就担任董事，她一直给予我们支持和指导。我们在英国、中国和其他地方的合作伙伴对她都很了解。

现在我们欢迎张誉忠 (Eugene Chang) 担任基金会董事。誉忠今年55岁，他在英格兰出生并接受教育，他的大部分职业生涯是在中国度过的。他目前生活在北京，这对于我们中国的官方及医学界的朋友及伦敦的董事及顾问都有很大的帮助。

2007年我们一如既往与我们在中国的老朋友一同工作，并逐渐扩展我们的关系网络。

1) 2007年度贝利马丁奖颁给了云南大理市第二人民医院佩吉健康中心的张建波医生。过去的十年中我们一直钦佩并支持张建波及其同事们所作的工作，他们的工作为艾滋病治疗和关怀树立了极好的榜样。

2) 继续与北京最主要的两家传染病院合作，即北京地坛医院和北京佑安医院。这两家传染病院都有对艾滋病感染者和患者的外展活动，比如地坛医院的红丝带之家，北京佑安医院的爱之方舟及恬园项目。我们还在中国首都与国家疾病控制中心及北京市卫生局合作，帮助北京的医院在艾滋病关怀、消除歧视与偏见方面为中国树立榜样。

3) 我们继续与青岛医学院张北川教授合作，在中国19个城市帮助同性恋人群。这19个城市遍及中国一半的省份。在有些地方，我们的支持还包括外展到其他艾滋病高危人群，比如女性性工作者。还有流动人口-这在中国是一个数量巨大的弱势群体，这一群体主要是从西部的贫困地区流向东部的富裕地区。

4) 2007年我们资助了两个培训研讨会。2007年11月份，我们和玛丽·金诺丝基金会一起，邀请了一组由爱丁堡西部总医院克利弗·林率领的包括伦敦3家医院 (晨曦医院、圣玛丽医院及巴斯伦敦医院) 的医护人员，来到中国的四川成都对当地医生护士进行培训。这次培训活动是由国家疾控中心与四川省人民医院共同组织、资助的，我们基金会与玛丽金诺丝基金会随后与四川省人民医院签署了合作备忘录。还是在2007年11月份，我们资助了巴斯伦敦医院的医生护士在广州举办了学习班。

5) 我们还回到新疆访问了我们的老朋友们，特别是乌鲁木齐的新疆传染病院，伊犁的针具交换中心。我们继续支持新疆传染病院的艾滋病病人及他们的家庭，以及为医院提供资金帮助来自维吾尔族社区的病人。我们在新疆开始帮助社区医院，比如位于乌

鲁木齐郊外的六道湾医院。由于当地的煤矿关闭，使得当地人比较贫困，而毒品的流行，使得很多人感染艾滋病毒。


6) 资助一名来自四川成都的医生到伦敦晨曦医院进修，感谢晨曦医院多年来接受很多来自中国的医生、护士进修。

我们要感谢很多朋友捐资或以其它形式帮助我们。我们的朋友Van Helden于2006年12月去逝，Chris Morris建议将纪念Van Helden的捐款转捐给我们基金会，我们的新董事张誉忠与李敏杰在伦敦举行民事结伴仪式（Civil Union）时建议他们的朋友将送给他们的礼物捐给贝利马丁基金会。在伦敦泰晤士河举办的龙舟比赛时，参赛的牛津大学分子医学研究所将我们基金会列为捐赠对象，位于Blackheath的教堂再次为我们募捐，我希望不久能前往那里做礼拜，并向教堂介绍我们是如何支配这些资金的。我们很快还将收到我和贝利·陈在约翰内斯堡的老朋友Edwin Polakow的部分遗产，价值10,000 兰特。

再次感谢在2007年所有支持我们的朋友，很高兴我们得到的捐款（97,930磅）与我们资助中国的项目款（95,187磅）如此接近。

去年我们基金会的净资产首次超过100万英镑，这包括我们的投资组合和得到的捐款。我们的投资组合倾向于香港的蓝筹股，再次证明贝利·陈看好香港的理论。如果香港继续繁荣，我们将有更多的资金帮助中国，包括香港。多年来的实践证明，我们的投资策略是成功的，我们的投资组合已经帮助我们渡过2008年前几个月的难关。

我还要感谢在美国的朋友及他们对贝利马丁基金的捐助，这群“美国佬”定期给我们捐助。我特别要感谢Carol Dauber对美国朋友基金的精心管理，美国朋友基金的捐赠名单见英文部分。
