Standing in the front row to the right of the Chairman are: Li Ning, President of You'an Hospital; Xu Lianzhi, our prizewinner in 2002; and Murong Feng, one of our prizewinners in 2008, and next to him our new project manager Frankie Bai. Chris Wood, Minister at our Embassy in Beijing, is standing between our Chairman and Li Ning, and at his left are Elizabeth Shields and Noel Sanborn of Barry & Martin America, Inc.

Chairman's Statement

The Trustees have pleasure in presenting the 14th Annual Report of our work on HIV/Aids in and with China.

China has changed dramatically since we started our operations in 1996. Most outsiders see only the glittering eastern cities of Beijing and Shanghai etc. But deeper within China there remains poverty and anxiety in the face of infections like HIV; and stigma and discrimination towards those who are suffering or at risk; and limited availability of drugs and emotional support.

Our friends in China are the first to lament the gap which exists between the newly rich and those who remain poor. The government shows its concern by assigning more and more funds to maladies like HIV, but the complex organisation of Chinese society often results in negligible amounts reaching those who most need help. Large foreign institutions have the same experience, whereas our small size and our longstanding contacts ensure that our funds have maximum reach.

This is the situation where our Trust finds itself in the second decade of the 21st century. On the one hand foreign institutions, many of which are feeling the pinch of the Great Recession, are withdrawing from China – e.g. Clinton Foundation in 2011 and Medecins sans Frontieres in 2010. Our development ministry, DfID, has largely downsized in China and no longer supports HIV care and prevention. The Global Fund has come to a "pause", whose length or permanence we cannot ascertain.

With so much withdrawal, our Trust is constantly aware of gaps where sick people and their families desperately need help, and the opportunities for us to bring material and emotional help, with quite small expenditures, are actually increasing. Furthermore, we possess that most precious asset in fast-changing China, namely a reputation for consistency and care in our work. Those who withdraw from China are surrendering this goodwill, and it is difficult for newcomers to acquire it in a more developed China where self-sufficiency is a matter of national pride. Barry & Martin's Trust is seen as an accepted and respected part of this new China, and we have more ability than ever to influence health-care in a good direction, and to tackle by our example the stigma and discrimination which exists towards HIV – not only in China.

Our reputation with the Chinese health authorities, and with the hospitals with which we work, is such that we can influence government and social attitudes in cities and towns which we visit; and a grant from the Trust is noted by local governments as a reason on its own to support a particular project.

It has remained our policy to expand always quite gradually in China, being careful to preserve the trust and good opinion we enjoy, and to set an example which others will follow. And in supporting our various projects around China, we like to continue to work with those people and institutions who have earned our trust, and only to add projects where the relation of trust has developed reliably.

In line with this policy we continue to work most closely (a) with the two principal infectious diseases hospitals of Beijing, the Ditan and the You'an, whose excellence in HIV/Aids treatment and care is a cornerstone example to others around China; (b) with our friends in Dali and Simao prefectures in Yunnan, and elsewhere in that most HIV-affected province; (c) with the Xinjiang Uighur Autonomous Region, the largest province of China, where our longstanding relationships have enabled us to access those who are suffering most; (d) with Sichuan, where infection is increasing rapidly and where we have built a trusting relationship with the Chengdu Contagious Diseases Hospital; and (e) with Professor Zhang Beichuan

and the outreach he has achieved to the gay -or MSM – community throughout China. This brings us into contact with MSM groups in two-thirds of the provinces of China, and with the health authorities which are required to assist them. We add cautiously to this list, when we find reliable counterparties, and we expect to include Guangxi in 2011.

In addition our annual prizes – we made our 11th annual prizegivings in 2010 – are warmly received all over China, and strongly influence good practice in Aids prevention and care. In 2011 we gave our prizes to nurses in Beijing and Xinjiang, and we named 2010 the Year of the Nurse, to encourage the HIV nursing community of China.

Our presence on the ground in China has been much helped in the last 2 years by our Trustee Eugene Chang who, while resident in Beijing, has developed excellent relations with our government and hospital friends, and with many of the individuals and groups whom we help. This has improved our insight. Following Eugene's recommendation we have appointed two volunteer project managers based in Beijing, Zhen Li and Frankie Bai, who can advise us how best to help among the socially-excluded gay and HIV positive community, and especially among those who are both gay and HIV positive.

At the London end we continue to benefit from the initiatives and advice of our Director, Dr. Shisong Jiang, and the support of The Mary Kinross Charitable Trust, whose Chairman Elizabeth Shields has completed more than 20 China visits with us, giving us the benefit of her long experience in the charitable field. We are all greatly helped by my niece Nathalie's assumption of the role of Clerk, in addition to that of Trustee, ensuring that all our financial strings are pulled together.

We remain grateful to, and responsible towards, our many friends who have continued to donate to our funds in London, as well as to friends who help us directly in China – like Daniel and Sally Zhou who have paid all our internal airfares. In the United States our 'sister' company has just changed its name to Barry & Martin America, Inc, because we found the previous name too cumbersome. I am happy to record below the names of our US donors in 2010, as well as our continued vivid appreciation of the role of Carol Dauber as Director, Secretary & Treasurer.

主席陈述/2010年度报告

基金会董事在此作我们在中国进行艾滋病工作的第 14 个年度报告。

中国自从 1996 年我们开始慈善事业以来经历了巨大的变化。很多外人都看到了光彩夺目的北京和上海等东部城市。然而纵观中国,仍然存在许多问题,如饥饿以及对感染疾病如艾滋病的忧虑;对 HIV 感染者及高危人群的侮辱及歧视;不能对患者在药物及精神方面给予足够支持。

我们中国的朋友最先体会到新富者与穷人之间的鸿沟。政府对此很关心并将越来越多多的资金用于诸如 HIV 之类的疾病。然而中国社会结构的复杂性导致了真正需要帮助的人却往往被忽视。大的国际组织也存在类似问题。而我们小型机构却因我们长期与当地人民保持紧密联系而确保了我们的资金得到了最充分有效的应用。

这是 21 世纪第二个十年我们基金会所面临的状况。一方面,许多外国机构受到经济大萧条的影响而撤出中国 – 比如克林顿基金会于 2011 年、无国界医生组织于 2010 年相继撤出。我国政府机构-英国海外发展署也大规模消减对中国的援助并不再资助艾滋病关怀与预防。另外,全球基金也停止了对中国的支持,何时重新开始尚且不知。

在这么多基金撤离中国的情况下,我们基金会深知病人及其家属所需要的迫切帮助与我们基金会从物质和精神方面所能给予病人的帮助还有很大差距。因此我们将增加我们目前尚为很小的预算。另外,我们在中国拥有做事持之以恒及小心谨慎(顾及他人感受)的声誉,这是我们在变化的中国所拥有的最宝贵财富。已从中国撤离的机构在这方面与我们比相对逊色。而后来者则很难在一个视自力更生为民族自尊心一部分的、不断发展的中国获取这样的品质。贝利马丁基金会在中国得到认可和尊重。我们从未象今天一样能够影响中国卫生健康领域,通过树立榜样消除对艾滋病的羞辱和歧视。我们的影响力超出了中国。

我们在中国卫生部门及我们所工作的医院中的声誉使我们可以影响当地政府及社会风气。我们所支持的项目常常被政府视为他们应该支持的项目。

我们的政策是在中国小心谨慎地逐渐拓展我们的项目,确保当地人民对我们的信任和 尊重。我们为别人树立榜样。为确保我们的项目在中国顺利开展,我们支持我们信任 的人和单位。我们只在信任和可靠的前提下扩展我们的项目。

在这样一个政策前提下,我们继续在以下几个方面工作: 1. 与北京两家传染病院,地坛和佑安医院合作。这两家医院在艾滋病关怀治疗方面为中国树立了榜样。2. 与中国艾滋病最严重的云南省的大理、思茅和其它艾滋病高发地区合作。3. 新疆维吾尔自治区,中国最大的省份,我们与自治区长期的友好关系使我们能够关怀最需要帮助的病人。4. 四川省,艾滋病感染率上升迅速。我们与成都传染病院建立了相互信任的关系。5. 与张北川教授的合作涉及同性或 MSM 人群的外展工作。这一工作使我们能够接触到全中国三分之二地区的 MSM 人群以及能够帮助他们的卫生工作者。在我们工作的名单上,我们希望在找到可靠的合作者后,将广西列入名单。

另外关于我们的年度奖(2010年我们颁发了第 11 届贝利马丁奖),我们的奖在中国受到了热烈欢迎,对艾滋病关怀与预防有深远影响。2011年的奖颁给了北京和新疆的几位护士,我们把 2010年称为护士年,以鼓励在中国艾滋病领域工作的护士群体。

我们在中国的工作在过去两年中得益于基金会董事张忠誉大力帮助。他常驻北京,与英国大使馆、我们资助的医院以及许多个人和小组建立了很好的友谊。这加深了我们的观察力。根据张忠誉的推荐,我们任命了两位以北京为基地的志愿者为项目经理,真理和白桦。他们使我们能最有效地帮助被社会排斥的同性恋人群及艾滋病感染者,特别是同性恋人群中的艾滋病感染者。

在伦敦方面,我们继续得益于基金会主任姜石松的工作以及玛丽金诺丝基金会的支持。该基金会主席伊丽莎白.石友思与我们一起访问中国至少 20 次之多,她多年来的慈善工作经验使我们受益匪浅。我侄女娜塔莉将基金会的总务工作视为己任并将基金会财务管理的井井有条。

我们感谢朋友们继续给我们伦敦的基金会捐款。也感谢直接帮助我们在中国工作的朋友,如周舸夫妇捐助我们在中国国内的旅行费用。我们在美国的姊妹机构因以前的名字比较拗口而改名为贝利马丁美国基金。很荣幸将 2010 年美国捐赠人名单随附如下。在此还要感谢美国基金的董事兼秘书及财务卡罗尔的辛勤工作。

Barry & Martin's Prizes 2010

1 - Beijing

We gave our principal prize to Nurse Fu Yan of Beijing You'an Hospital for her outstanding work with Aids patients over more than 15 years. In a particular mark of respect for Fu Yan's work, Madam Wang Xiaoya of CCTV acted as presenter at the prizegiving, which was reported the same evening on CCTV 10 and Wang Xiaoya promised continuous support to our Trust (photo below left).





A particular contribution of Nurse Fu Yan to Aids Care in China has been her creation of the Quiet Garden at You'an Hospital in 2007, sponsored by our Trust. The Quiet Garden has been enormously successful in reaching out to newly infected gay HIV-positive men, and over the last year Fu Yan has been expanding this concept to other hospitals in China including Zhengzhou, Shenyang, Chengdu, Chongqing etc. She is standing next to Martin in the photo above right. There is set out below a letter we received from a bereaved parent in Xinjiang:

Respectful Mr. Martin Gordon:

How are you!

My name is Jianguo Cai, living in Shihesi, I was a repairmen before retired. Me and my wife spent 30 years together.

Xin Cai is our only son, he was tested HIV+ last year in Urumqi. He decided to hide the truth and not received confirmatory test at that time. He resigned his work and hided somewhere. Afterwards, he told us that he lived in fear of die because of HIV in every single day. He was afraid to be exposed to others, which will let other people look down up him and us. More importantly, he was scare to let us disappointed. But the way he thought eventually lead him to lost his best time for treatment.

My salary is 1000 yuan after retired which could barely support our whole family. Xin Cai spend all of his money due to lost of confidence after found as HIV+. We can't afford the medical cost due to those reasons above.

From January to March, Xin Cai reeived well treatment and services in Infectious Disease Hospital, volunteers from Tiantong Group often came and accompany him. What surprised most is that medical expenses of Xin Cai is funded by Barry & Martin Trust which hugely relieved our burden.

Early of March, although the medical staff tried every thing they can to rescue my son but unfortunately, he passed away with a lot regrets.

Mr. Martin, very thankful to your support to Xin Cai and he was very grateful for what you did, he always want to thank you in person when you visit Xinjiang, even though he is not here anymore but I still want to pass his and our family's thanks to you by this letter.

In here, HIV/AIDS is always linked to morality, people will think of drug use and multiple sexual partners. Now, all of relatives know my son is died of HIV/AIDS and he is gay, most of our relatives are not contact with us anymore, neighbors see us as stranger. So we decided to back to homedown.

Although we suffered a lot of discriminations from our relatives, but we saw a most valuable spirit from your trust, medical staff in IDH and volunteers in Tiantong Group.
